## Birding Singapore – 26<sup>th</sup> April 2015

It was still raining when Peter and Andy, birders from England, and I got to the central Catchment Nature Reserve for a day's birding. It was an ominous start but we just got on with it. It was tough going as we were only hearing rain although we did hear two Brown Hawk Owls. At length, we got to MacRitchie Reservoir where we managed to see a Large-tailed Nightjar. It took a long time for the sky to brighten enough for us to look for birds. A noisy Stork-billed Kingfisher cheered us up as did a solitary Changeable Hawk Eagle, a group of Oriental Magpie-robins and a male Yellow-rumped Flycatcher.

After an hour, we retreated to Jelutong Tower where our luck changed for the better. It was still drizzling but we managed to see Red-crowned Barbet, Blue-throated Bee-eater, a pair of Chestnut-

bellied Malkoha, a male Jambu Fruit Dove, a male Lesser Green Leafbird and several van Hasselt's Sunbirds.

We were surprised to leave the forest, still drizzling, with a total of 41 species.

The rain had stopped by the time we got to our second spot – Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve. It was high tide at the bridge so we stopped to look around in the flooded mangroves. We saw Collared Kingfisher, roosting Common Redshanks, Grey Heron, Little Egret and a small Estuarine Crocodile. We proceeded on to the main hide and added Great Egret, Striated Heron and a sub-adult White-bellied Sea Eagle. The highlight of the morning was seeing a Great-billed Heron fly in which we managed to approach for closer shots. It fished using different stalking techniques but without much success. At length, we returned to the visitor centre where a rather noisy crowd had gathered. We moved on to the Coastal Trail where we stumbled on a group of photographers shooting a Copper-throated Sunbird. We joined in the fun for a while and then climbed to the top of the Coastal Trail for a bird's eye view of the Straits of Johor and the Malaysian coast. It was getting warm but we lingered adding Sunda Pygmy

Woodpecker, Oriental Dollarbird, Common Iora, Ashy Tailorbird and Oriental White-eye to our growing list. We left with a list of 32 species.

After lunch, we headed east to Lorong Halus Wetland, an open country and wetland on the north-east coast of Singapore. We spent an hour exploring the quiet country roads, the reedbeds and a polluted ditch, tallying 29 species despite the generally unproductive time of the day. Good birds seen here Purple Heron, 2 full summer-plumaged Chinese Pond Heron, Brahminy Kite, Savanna Nightjar, Roseringed and Red-breasted Parakeets, Long-tailed Shrike, Paddyfield Pipits and Baya Weavers attending to their pendulous nests.

Our last site was close by — Pasir Ris Park. We got there in ten minutes. This was an area of coastal parkland and mangrove further east of Lorong Halus. A drizzle had started and this had the effect of making the birdlife quieter than normal. Still, we managed to see Red Junglefowl, Collared Kingfisher, Common lora and Asian Brown Flycatcher. At the mangroves around Sungei Tampines, we added Blackcrowned Night-heron, Laced Woodpecker and a family of Oriental Pied Hornbills to end our hour-long birding here on 24 species.

Overall, we did very well despite the wet weather, clocking a total of 85 species of birds spanning a range of diverse habitats, as well as other wildlife such as Long-tailed Macaque and Estuarine Crocodile.
